- » Submit official transcripts from any other accredited college or university you have attended.

Once we receive your admissions materials, you will then receive a letter of acceptance from us. You will then schedule your new student orientation session. Orientation provides essential information for all new students. During orientation, you will meet with an academic advisor who will help you schedule your classes for the semester.

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EARN AN ASSOCIATE DEGREE ON YOUR WAY TO A BACHELOR'S DEGREE

The Bachelor of Organizational Supervision (BOS) is a degree-completion program for individuals who hold an associate degree in a technical field from a regionally accredited institution of higher education, or junior standing at The University of Akron. The program provides graduates with advanced supervisory and leadership competencies necessary for professional and career advancement.

The program is designed around a set of core competencies applicable to supervisory positions in a wide variety of technical fields. These competencies include effective oral and written communication, application of ethical principles to workplace situations, application of quantitative skills, problem solving, project management, and development of specific leadership and supervisory skills.

PROGRAM FOCUS

The program focuses on building experience and competencies for working in teams. All students are required to complete a minimum of 34 credit hours of 300-400 level courses including:

- » Supervision in a Technical Environment
- » Ethical Issues in the Workplace
- » Information Design
- » Leadership Principles & Practices in Technical Organizations
- » Community Service and Leadership in a Global Context
- » Leading Project Teams in Technical Organizations
- » Operational Assessments and Improvements in Technical Organizations
- » Human Capital Development for Technical Organizations
- » Intercultural Communications
- » Group Decision Making or Business & Professional Speaking
- » Senior Seminar in Organization Supervision (capstone course).
- » Industrial Organizational Psychology
